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# INTRODUCTION

## Contents and Organization

This is a dictionary of names and name-elements from Viking Age Scandinavian runic inscriptions, including some from outside of Scandinavia. For more information about the organization scheme see Peterson 1999.

The current version, version 3, is based upon material from *Samnordisk runtextdatabas*, May 2000 version (<http://www.nordiska.uu.se/forskn/samnord.htm>). (The following inscriptions are missing from the database but extracts are provided here: UNOR1996:17, DRNOR1996:7, DRNOR1997:6, DRNOR1998:7, DRNOR1998:8.)

In the first part of the dictionary, personal names are presented -- and at the most length -- in the section on PERSONAL NAMES: Names of Viking Age People. This section was revised after the previous, February 2001 edition of *Nordiskt runnamslexikon* was published.

Minor changes have been made in the overall organization. Some uninterpreted entries have been added, but no new headwords. Two small sections have been added: Names of Mythical Characters and Names of the Primary Figures of Christianity and of Saints. The second portion of the dictionary includes Place Names (with

uninterpreted citations). The final portion of the dictionary is the Bibliography for all sections.

## Symbols

For an explanation of inscription codes (including an explanation of the \$ mark) refer to Lagman & Williams 1989 (which contains information on the Swedish Viking Age Rune Database as of that date) and *Inskriftsinformation* (Inscription Information) and *Litteratur* (Bibliography) under the *Diverse (Other)* Menu in *Samnordisk runtextdatabas*. Information regarding the symbols may also be found in the documentation enclosed with the *Samnordisk runtextdatabas*.

An asterisk in front of an inscription number indicates a new reading, collected from Owe 1996 (appendix pg. 90 ff.).

An arrow (→) in front of a term in the dictionary indicates that the term to which the arrow is pointing is referenced in its own entry elsewhere in the dictionary.

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# PERSONAL NAMES: Names of Viking Age People

## Introduction

The number of entries are approx 1,880, including cross-references. The number of items concerning individual names is approximately 1,530, of which about 130 consist of alternative interpretations of individual examples or additional evidence (see further information under Index Forms). The ratio of men's names to women's names is about 3:1. In addition to personal names, entries are provided for name-elements (first elements and second elements in compound names) with a list

of attested compounds. There are about 160 such entries. In addition, there is in the material some name-elements which do not have their own entries because they appear only as one or two examples.

Items in bold type are transcribed runic sequences, or have characteristics in a particular sequence (transcribed examples). Some items from the *Samnordisk runtextdatabas* that are designated in bold type are, however, shown in the dictionary with

(attempted) interpretations, with bibliographical references.

## Index Forms

The bold name-forms heading each entry are the normalized runic Norse forms. As far as feasible, I am taking into consideration the attested forms, while at the same time following the etymology of the name and following what is known about linguistic development during the period in question.

As an exception, non-Norse names are found as index forms. This would pertain to Celtic names in Norse inscriptions from the British Isles or English names in Danish inscriptions on coins.

Variant forms, separated by a slash ( / ), are used **a)** when it's impossible to tell from the evidence if there are some specific sound changes to vowels or not (example: Ás- / Æs-, Anundr / Önundr); **b)** when it's impossible to tell the form by the evidence, but the names are etymologically closely related (example: *Gripi* / *Græipi*); **c)** when variant forms conditioned by phonology have been grouped together (example: *Hróð(gísl* / *Hróðvísł*). This latter category corresponds to the words "compare with" within parentheses (see the following).

The phrase "compare with ..." in parentheses after the index form indicates that the name is phonologically related to another name, i.e.: *Guðlaug* (compare with *Gullaug*). If such variant forms are counted together, the number of names is reduced by 27.

After the index name listing there may occur parens containing "see... ", which indicates that all instances are given alternative interpretations. Three types can be discerned, as in these examples:

**1) Abbi** (see *Api*, *Æbbi*): Runic form abi (Nominative:), aba (accusative:), which occur in three inscriptions, and have been interpreted in three different ways. Which of these is correct is uncertain; in the same rune-row (or a similar rune-row) in different inscriptions it may of course represent different names.

**2) IngigæiRR** (see *Ingigærð*): Three examples can be interpreted in two different ways, as one masculine name, *IngigæiRR*, (which contains two very common name-elements) is not otherwise attested, or else two

unknown single-element names for which we are uncertain whether they ever existed or not.

**3) Galmi** (see *Gamli*): This represents a single instance of a name, for which naturally only one of the two interpretations is correct, but which one is uncertain. In other words, the exact number of names in this dictionary cannot be determined.

When some examples under a name entry have alternative interpretations, we have shown them with a slash ( / ) and "see..." within parentheses immediately after the inscription code. Example: In the entry for the name *Auðbiörn* one example is given, aubiarn, which also may be interpreted as *Øybiörn*; this is indicated as: aubiarn Sö211 / (see *Øybiörn*) and similarly under *Øybiörn*.

After the index form often follows a question mark in parentheses (?). This indicates that the interpretation (which is reflected in the index name) of the examples is uncertain.

## Comparison with Medieval Material

Under the index form, names that are corresponding forms, if any, from Old Danish, Old West Norse and Old Swedish sources are listed. The cited name forms are collected from DGP, Lind, Lind Bynames, SMP and SMPs (in the last case the form from the index card).

When SMP (and SMPs) only has the same citations as DGP, Lind and Lind Bin., no old Swedish form is given.

If the name in question according to the above-named sources is only extrapolated from a place-name, then it is not listed.

A difficulty with the medieval materials is that a name can be a homonym of the Runic Norse name but may not have the same (supposed) etymological origin. In cases where this is obvious the medieval names have not been cited, otherwise they are listed as "etymology uncertain" or marked in some way.

The occurrence as an Old Norse name in England has been noted only in such instances when there are no equivalent examples in Norse sources.

## Etymologies

The derivation of names and name-elements is done first and foremost with the help of Old West Norse word-materials. These are mostly collected from Fritzner, thus discrepancies in normalizations in, i.e., *Óþyrmir* (Lind): *úþyrmir* (Fritzner). Derivations from proto-Scandinavian or other proto-Germanic forms is not done throughout but only in such cases where such derivation appears to be needed.

Etymological (and other, in this context, relevant) literature is mentioned after the list of examples. No special mention is made to references when the meaning is inherent from the inscription code (these are marked with a dollar-sign character, \$, when present). Note that the name interpretations of DR are in the chapter "Rod- go navneforsrad" (DR col. 625 ff.).

## Examples Referring to the Same Person

Examples referring to the same person, when they are not cited in the references, have been given with the aid of Williams 1990 (*Inskrifter med genealogiskt samband*, p. 185 ff.), Axelson 1993, Lerche Nielsen 1997 (p. 1 ff.) without it being noted in the dictionary. When a name exists in two or more occurrences in the same inscription, it is assumed that they refer to the same person. An exception may occur where the same name in one inscription can refer to a different person; these are expressly noted. When a name from a coin die exists in several inscriptions (indicated with the inscription code DRM+number), it is assumed that they are the same person without it being noted that it refers to a different person.

**ÁdiarfR** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Adiærf*. First element perhaps < Germanic \*aȝ- (compare with → Á-), second element → -diarfR.

Nominative: aterfr U597, [atiarfR] U1130† Accusative: aterf U861, atiarf U847\$. Refs: SMP 1 col. 16.

**Ádís (?)** (feminine name). O.Swed. *Adis*. First element perhaps < Germanic \*aȝ- (compare with → Á-), second element → -dís. Nominative: apis U1107. Refs: SMP 1 col. 16.

**ÁdísA (?)** (feminine name). Weak side-form of → Ádís. Nominative: ntisa Ög163

**Áðakán** (masculine name). Celtic name. Genitive: áþakans BrOlsen;208b

**Áðalmærki** or -mækíR. Masculine by-name. A compound name formed from the OW.Norse prefix *aðal-* "foremost, premier" and the OW.Norse noun *merki* n. "sign; banner" or OW.Norse *mækir* m. "sword". Accusative: áþal:miki DR237

**Áðísl** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Adhils*, OW.Norse *Aðils* From \*Aþa-gíslaR, \*aþa- or else from \*aþal- "noble; foremost". Second element → -gísl / -gil. Nominative: áþisl U35, BrOlsen;215\$. Accusative: áþisl DR221\$B. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 62 f.

**Áðísla** (feminine name). Feminine form of → Áðísl. Nominative: oþ[is]la Sö274

**-aðr** m. < proto-Scandinavian \*-habuR, related to OW.Norse *höd* f. "fight". Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 98, 121. Compounds: *Fast-*, *Folk-*.

**Áfastr** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Afwastus* (Latin), *Avæst*. First element perhaps < Germanic \*az- (compare with → Á-), second element → -fastr. Accusative: afast U796\$. Refs: SMP 1 col. 17.

**Áfríðr** (feminine name) O.Swed. *Afridh*. First element perhaps < Germanic \*az- (compare with → Á-), second element → -fríðr. Nominative: afirib U1011B, afriþ U52, [afriþ] U565†, afxriþ U508, (a)friþr U1012, [friþ] U1116†, ifriþr U824(?) Accusative: afriþi Öl56{27}. Refs: SMP 1 col. 17.

**Ag-** From Germanic \*az- "point" or "anxiety, fear". Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 62 f. Compounds: -mundr, -viðr.

**Ágautr** (masculine name) O.Dan. *Agot*. First element → Á-, second element → -gautr. Accusative: akaut U755

**Agmundr / Ögmundr** (masculine name) O.Swed. *Aghmund*, OW.Norse *Ögmundr*. First element → Ag-, second element → -mundr. Nominative: agmunr Sö170, agmuntr Vg178, ahmuntr Sö144, ahmutr Vg34, aukmuntr Ög224A Accusative: agmunt U656\$, akmunt N213, [akmunt] U682†, [in]hmuntr U1097, ukmut Vg150

**Agni** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Aghen* (?), O.Swed. *Agne*, OW.Norse *Agni*. Derived from Germanic \*az- "point" or "anxiety, fear", corresponding to OH.Germ. *Agino*. Nominative: ahni U546\$. Refs: Janzén 1947a p. 264 f., Otterbjörk 1979 p. 73.

**Águti** (masculine name). First element → Á-, second element → -guti. Nominative: agotihhi U1018(?), akuti Ög232\$, U768, ak(u)ti Sö219, akyti U719, ak-(t)in Vg74(?) Accusative: aguta Ög190, akut- SöATA6163 / 61\$. Note: Enl. Lagman (1990 p. 90) described the rune y for example in U719 as the vowel / ö / arising from the diphthong / au /. The rune however may easily stand for / ú / or / ó / (see a.a. p. 91).

**Agviðr** (masculine name) (compare with Áviðr). O.Dan. *Aghwith*. First element → Ag-, second element → -viðr. Nominative: [ahuiþr]

U1133†, ahuiþr U1134. These examples all refer to the same person.

**ÁgæiRR** (masculine name) (compare with ÁvæiRR). First element → Á-, second element → -gæiRR. Nominative: [aker] U817† / (see Ágærðr), akiR U471(?)

**Ágærðr** (?) (feminine name, see ÁgæiRR). First element → Á-, second element → -gærðr. Nominative: [aker] U817†

**Ailmær** (masculine name). English name, O.Engl. *Æthelmær*. Nominative: ailmer DRM1, DRM2, DRM3, DRM4, DRM5, almer DRM11

**Áki** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Aki*, O.Swed. *Ake*, OW.Norse *Áki*. Diminutive form with the -k-suffix. \*anuR "forefather, ancestor" or by-name with a suffix from \*Anu-. The name is considered to be equivalent to OH.Germ. *Aniho*. Nominative: aki Ög183, Sm16A, U570, U1016\$, U1158, oaki DR288. Accusative: aka U946, [aka] Sö238†. Refs: Hornby 1947 p. 203, 210 f., Janzén 1947b p. 133, Hellquist 1948 p. 1417, Modéer 1955 p. 26, Otterbjörk 1979 p. 137, Magnússon 1989 p. 8. See also *Punn-Áki*.

**Al-** < Germanic \*ala- (\*alla-) "all, whole". Al- may also be derived from proto-Scandinavian \*alu "defense, protection, luck", \*aba- "noble, foremost" or OW.Norse *alfr* (see → *Alf*). Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 63 f. Compounds: -bóðr, -drif(?), -gautr, -gisl, -ríkR, -prúðr, -véR, -ví.

**Albóðr** (masculine name). Old Low German name. First element < Germanic \*ala- (see → *Al*), second element < Germanic \*baud- or perhaps \*-būd- (from the verb *bjuda*). The earlier understandings of this name are recently contradicted by new understandings of pronunciation. Accusative: albop U391\$. Refs: Ahlsson 1988.

**Ald-** From the proto-Germanic adjective \*alða- "old", Gothic *alds*, OH.Germ. *ald*, *alt*, O.Engl. *eald*. Compare with i.e. OH.Germ. *Aldulf*, *Altwidus*. Refs: Salberger 1980a. Compounds: -viðr.

**Aldi** (masculine name). Short form for names in → *Ald*- such as → *Aldviðr*, *AldulfR*. (U595, medieval). Nominative: [alti] Öl10{5}†. Refs: Salberger 1980a.

**Aldríf** (feminine name). Of uncertain etymology. First element perhaps → *Al*-,

second element perhaps *-dríf*, related to the second element in OW.Norse *Sigrdríff(a)* (found as both a mythological name and as a real personal name, see Lind col. 884 f.). A different opinion holds that the second element is *Sigrdríff(a)*. Genitive: [altr]ifaR Sö31\$. Refs: Lex. poet. p. 494, Kvaran & Jónsson 1991 p. 484.

**Aldviðr** (masculine name). Old Gotlandic. *Aldviðr* (G151, medieval). First element → *Al-*, second element → *-viðr*. Nominative: altuibr G276

**Alf-** From OW.Norse *alfr* m. "elf, a type of subterranean being". Also found as a second element → *-alfr*. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 64, 99. Compounds: *-arr*, *-dís(?)*, *-gautr*, *-gæiRR*, *-hildr*, *-kæll*, *-lakR*, *-ríkR*, *-vin*.

**Alfarr** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Alvar*, OW.Norse *Álfarr*. First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-arr*. Accusative: *alfar* DR387\$. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 64, 101.

**Alfdís (?)** (feminine name) OW.Norse *Álfdis*. First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-dís*. Nominative: a[lti- -] Sö115\$

**Alfgautr** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Algut* (?), O.Swed. *Algut* (?), OW.Norse *Algautr* (?) (see Janzén 1947b p. 64, 104, UR 2 p. 362, 455, SMP 1 col. 58). First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-gautr*. Nominative: alfkautr U573

**AlfgæiRR** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Alger* (?), OW.Norse *Álfgeirr*. First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-gæiRR*. Nominative: alfkeR DRM6 Accusative: alfkilR U515

**Al(f)hildr** (feminine name). O.Dan. *Alvild*, OW.Norse *Álfhildr*. First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-hildr*. Genitive: alhiltar Sö254

**Alfkæll** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Alfkil*. First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-kæ(t)i*. Nominative: alfkil DR107, DR376 Accusative: [alfkit] Sö257†\$

**AlflakR** (masculine name). First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-lækR* / *-lakR*. Accusative: alflak DR401

**Alfríkr** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Alfrik*, OW.Norse *Alfríkr* (see Lind col.16), *Alrekr* (?)

(see Janzén 1947b p. 64). First element → *Alf-*, second element → *-ríkR*. Nominative: alfríkr DRM8, DRM9, alfríkr U37, alfr-k DRM7

**-alfr** m. See first element → *Alf-*. Compounds: *GæiR*.

**Alfin / Ölfun** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Alfin*, O.Swed. *Alwin*. First element → *Alf-*, second element < Germanic \*-winiz "friend". Accusative: alfunin DR384, aulfun DR287. Refs: K. M. Nielsen 1960 p. 20, 24 (DR287), Otterbjörk 1979 p. 75.

**Algautr** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Algut*, O.Swed. *Algut*, OW.Norse *Algautr*. First element → *Al-*, second element → *-gautr*. Nominative: alkautr U509

**Algísl** (masculine name). The first element is perhaps from → *Alf* (see also → *Al-*), the second element → *-gísl* / *-gils*. Nominative: alkisl Vg45

**Ali or Alli** (masculine name) (compare with *Óli*). O.Dan. *Ali*, *Alli*, O.Swed. *Ale*, *Alle*, OW.Norse *Áli*. *Áli*: is the diminutive form with the *-l* suffix of a name from \*Ana-, \*Anu- (related to OH.Germ. *Analo*, *Anulo*, *Anilo*) or the short form of → *ÁlæifR*, → *ÓlafR*. *Alli*: may also be the short form of names in → *Al-* or → *Alf-*. The names cannot be told apart in the runic inscriptions. Nominative: ali Ög22, Vg75\$, Vg137, U203, U572, U867\$, U898, UNOR1995;19, [ali] U986†, Ög177†, aljinj U194 Genitive: ala UFv1959;196, DR209B\$, [ala] U986†, alah UFv1959;196 Accusative: ala Sm19, U905\$, DR209A\$, [ala] U506†, [alah] U1038† (see Owe 1999). **AlmgæiRR** (masculine name). OW.Norse *Álmgeirr*. First element → *Alm-*, second element → *-gæiRR*. Accusative: almkar U749

**AlríkR** (masculine name). OW.Norse *Alrekr*, Ölrekr. First element → *Al-*, second element → *-ríkR*. Nominative: Aliriku Vg119C, alrik U505, alrikR Sö106, al-íkr| U654\$(?), Alrik - Vg119A, Aslriku Vg119B. Genitive: alriks Sö101. Examples in Sö101, Sö106 may be the same person.

**Alþrúðr** (feminine name). First element → *Al-*, second element → *-þrúðr*. Nominative: (a)lrþuþr M3 Accusative: alþrupi M5

"**Alvarðr**", see *Hallvarðr*

**Alvér / Ölvér** (masculine name). O.Dan. Ølvir, O.Swed. Alver, Ølver, OW.Norse Ølvir. First element \**Alu-* or \**Ala-* (compare with → *Al-*), second element → *-véR*. One researcher considers that the first element in this name comes from Gothic *alhs* "temple" and that the original meaning thus should be "heathen priest". Nominative: aluiR Sö159, Vg100, Hs11, [au]liR Vg87, oliR ÖgMÖLM1960;230, uliR Vg127 Accusative: alui N271B, a(l)(u)in N59\$, (a)(l)ui Ög213, a-ui U696(?). **Gás** (feminine name). Compare with the O.Dan. and O.Swed. masculine by-name *Gas*, OW.Norse amsculine by-name *Gás*. From OW.Norse *gás* f. "goose". Nominative: *gas* Sö7, [gos] U1102†.

**Gási** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Gasi* (found as a by-name *Gassi*), O.Swed. *Gase* (found as a by-name *Gasse*), OW.Norse *Gási* (found as a by-name *Gási*, *Gassi*). **HallgæiRR** (masculine name) OW.Norse *Hallgeirr*. First element → *Hall-*, second element → -gæiRR. Nominative: hkaiR G59.

**Hallr (?)** (masculine name). OW.Norse *Hallr* (found as a by-name). From OW.Norse *hallr* m. "(flat) stone, slab". As first element → *Hall-*. Accusative: al Sö184\$. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 42, 77, de Vries 1962 p. 205, Magnússon 1989 p. 301. Note: According to Lind Bin. (col. 132)

**Heðin- / Hiðinbiörn** (masculine name) O.Swed. *Hidhinbiorn*. First element → Heðin- / Hiðin-, second element → -biörn. Nominative: [hiþibiarn] U1038†. Accusative: hiþinbiurn U920\$.

**Heðin- / Hiðindís** (feminine name). O.Swed. *Hidhindis*. First element → Heðin- / Hiðin-, second element → -dís. Nominative: hiþintis U1151, hiþintis U770. Examples may perhaps refer to the same person.

**-hofði.** First element formation is uncertain, as a second element → -hofði. Nominative: stulnufþi Vg108.

**HölfR**, see HáulfR / HölfR.

**HöR** (?) (masculine name, see IóR) OW.Norse Hár (mythological, fictional character). From the OW.Norse adjective hár, hör, hór (< \*hauhaR) "high". Nominative: HauR BoPeterson1992P.

**Höskuldr** (?) (masculine name) OW.Norse Höskuldr. Several proposals for the etymology have been put forward: 1) the name is a development from proto-Scandinavian. HagustaldaR, which is supported by the runic inscriptions Valsfjord and Kjølevik, Norway (compare with OH.Germ. hagustalt, "owner of an enclosed area"); 2) the name may be compounded from OW.Norse höð f. **Iórkæll** (masculine name, see Pórkæ(t)l). First element → lór-, second element → -kæ(t)l. Nominative: [iorkil] Öl89{49}†. Note: reading is based on older drawings (see ÖIR p. 117, pl. XXX). The reading þorkil (B. E. Nilsson 1974 p. 244) is an emendation.

**IórulfR** (masculine name, see HörlfR) First element → lór-, second element → -ulfR. Accusative: iurulf G110B. Refs: Wessén 1927 p. 107, Janzén 1947b p. 26, Johnsen 1968 p. 112 ff.

**Iórunnr** (feminine name) OW.Norse lórunn. First element → lór-, second element → -unnr / -uðr. Nominative: iaurnun Sö266, iurun Sö288, U143, N61A, -(u)(r)(u)(n) U147\$. Genitive: [io]runa U142. Accusative: iuruni N251, (in)u(r)un(in) Vg2B. Refs: Peterson 1981a p. 58 not 10. Examples in U142, U143, U147 refer to the same person.

**IóR (?)** (masculine name, see HöR). From OW.Norse jór (< Germanic \*ehwaz) m. "horse". Nominative: iauR BoPeterson 1992Q.

**Ióstæinn** (masculine name). O.Dan. losten, OW.Norse lósteinn. First element → ló, second element → -stæinn. Nominative: iystin U323 / (see Øystæinn) (see Lagman 1990 p. 45), [yustin] Ög187. Accusative: iusti[n] U319, iust Ög189(?), iystin Sm106 / (see Øystæinn) (see Lagman 1990 p. 45). Refs: Hornby 1947 p. 200.

"**Ísbjörn**", see Ás- / Æsbiörn.

"**Iuddi**", see lúti.

**Iuli** (masculine name). O.Dan. Iuli, O.Swed. lule. A short form of names in Ígul-. Nominative: iuli Sö362\$. Accusative: iula Vg184. Refs: Peterson 1986.

**Iúti** (masculine name). O.Dan. Iuti (found as a by-name), O.Swed. Iute (found as a by-name), OW.Norse lúti (found as a by-name). From O.Swed. iute m. "Jute, person from Jutland". Accusative: iuta Ög64, U4, DR213 Note: The two Swedish runic examples are alternatively explained as corresponding to O.Swed. lodde, ludde. This name is deemed, however, to be a short form of the borrowed name Jordan (Modéer 1957 p. 57 f.), thus the previous interpretation may be incorrect.

**Iútski** masculine by-name From the O.Swed. adjective iutsker "Jutish, from Jutland". Nominative: iutska DRM25.

**Ivarr (?)** (masculine name, see Ióarr) O.Dan. Iwar, O.Swed. Ivar, OW.Norse Ivarr. Of disputed derivation. First element probably from OW.Norse ýr (< Germanic \*íwaz) m. "yew (*Taxus baccata*); yew-bow", second element → -arr. This name could also be a grammatical development (in the first element) from → Ingvarr. Nominative: iuar Öl93, Sm80, [iuar] Ög130†. **Iöfurfast / -föst** (feminine name). First element → lōfur-, second element → -fast / -föst. Nominative: iafurfast U846, iafurfost U272, iufurfast U931, iufurfast U898, iufurfas[t] U1089, iufur[-ast] U993. Genitive: iufurfast U312. Accusative: iafa=ur=k=ut=fast U313, [iufirfast] U314†. Examples in U312, U313, U314 refer to the same person.

**Iöfurfríðr** (feminine name). First element → *löfur-*, second element → *-fríðr*. Nominative: [iafurfríðr...] U1098A, iyfur\*firþ U75.

**Iöfurr** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Iuvur*, OW.Norse *löfurr*. From OW.Norse *jöfurr* (proto-Scandinavian. \*eburaR) m. "prince", figuratively from "wild boar". As first element → *löfur-*. Compare with → *lór-*. Nominative: iofur U1015\$, iufur U1056, U1065, U1121\$, [iufur] U1073†, U1086†, U1131†. Accusative: iaſur U901, iufur U319, U904, [iufur] U1005. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 83 f., Hellberg 1965 p. 47 f. Examples in U901, U904 refer to the same person.

**Iöfurstaenn (?)** (masculine name). First element → *löfur-*, second element → *-staenn*. Nominative: if[r]ſ[t]a[in] Sö234.

**Iörundi (?)** (masculine name). Weak side-form of → *lörundr*; which is somewhat doubtful. Genitive: [in]arunta U1085 / (see *lörundr*). Accusative: iaruta Sö292. Refs: Otterbjörk 1983a p. 30, Peterson 1983b p. 207 med not 12, Åhlén 1997 p. 168 f.

**Iörundr** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Iarund*, *lorund*, O.Swed. *lorund*, *lærund*, *lørund*, OW.Norse *lörundr*. Of disputed origin. First element may be from OW.Norse *jara* f. "battle", second element → *-undr* / *-vindr*. Nominative: iaruntr U347, iaruntr U307, U779, iaru[ntr] U425\$, [iaruntr] U762, iarutr Vg92, in[or]uidr U989, [iorunt]r Öl54{25}\$, U72, iuruntr U323, U1006, iurun[tr] U1106, [iuruntr] U995†, iurunt... U942, [iyruntr] U977†, ...[runir] U1063\$?. Genitive: [in]arunta U1085 / (see *lörundi*). Accusative: iaru(n)t U426, [iarunt] Sö21†, iarut U43A, U413, iaruta Sö292 / (see *lörundi*), ierunt Sö260, U1168, iorunt U753, in(o)rut U1048, iurunt U917. Refs: Janzén 1947a p. 237, 1947b p. 84 f. Examples in U762, U779 refer to the same person.

Nominative: kabi U792. Refs: DGP 2 col. 525, Modéer 1955 p. 135, 1964 p. 103.

**Kaða** (masculine name). OW.Norse masculine by-name *Kaða* (Heggstad 1930 p. 355; compare with Lind Bin. s.n. *Kváða*). From OW.Norse *kaða* f. "hen". Accusative: kaþu DR83\$. Refs: DGP 1 col. 731.

**Kafli** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Kafle* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse by-name *Kafli*. From OW.Norse *kafli* m. "a piece cut off, a part". Nominative: kafli Vg158.

**KagR (?)** (masculine name, see *Gagarr*, *GagR*, *KákR*) O.Swed. (Latin) *Kagus*. Of uncertain etymology. Nominative: [kahu] U1058†(?), kakr U828, U925. Accusative: kak Ög135, U137, U925, U1108†, kakr Sö314\$. Refs: see under *GagR*.

**KákR (?)** (masculine name, see *Gagarr*, *GagR*, *KagR*) O.Swed. *Kakir* (*Kaker*). From O.Swed. *\*káker* (< proto-Scandinavian. \*kákaR) m. "wretch, bungler" or perhaps "pole, stake, tree-stump". Nominative: kakr U828, U925. Accusative: kak Ög135, U137, U925, U1108†, kakr Sö314\$. Refs: Elmevik 1967 p. 134, see f.ö. under *GagR*.

**KalfR** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Kalf* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Kalf* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Kálfr* (found as a by-name). From OW.Norse *kalfr* m. "calf". Genitive: kalfs U338B. Accusative: kalf U337, U341, U342\$, U875, [kalf] U981†, [ka=nlf] U986†(?) (see Lerche Nielsen 2000 p. 154 f.). Examples in U337, U338, U341, U342 refer to the same person.

**Kali** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Kali* (see DGP 1 col. 722; found as a by-name *Kale*?), O.Swed. *Kale* (found as a by-name, etymology uncertain), OW.Norse *Kali* (found as a by-name). Derived from the OW.Norse verb *kala* "to freeze, to be cold". Nominative: kali Vg73 / (see *Kalli*), U660, U708, DR130, DRM47, DRM48 (2 ggr), kal[in] U102. Accusative: kala Sm11 / (see *Galli*, *Kalli*), Sm16B / (see *Kalli*), Vg22 / (see *Kalli*). Refs: UR 1 p. 142 (arguing three alternatives).

**Káll** (?) (masculine name). O.Dan. by-name *Kal*, OW.Norse by-name *Kál*. From O.Swed. *kal* m. "kål" related to OW.Norse *kál* n. "cabbage (*Brassica oleracea*)". Nominative: kal Sö109. Accusative: [kal] U498†

**Kalli** (?) (masculine name) O.Dan. *Kalli*, O.Swed. *Kalle*. Assimilated form of → *Karl*? Nominative: *kali* Vg73 / (see *Kali*). Accusative: *kala* Sm11 / (see *Galli*, *Kali*), Sm16B / (see *Kali*), Vg22 / (see *Kali*). Refs: DR col. 673 (doubts that an assimilated form existed in runic language).

**Kampi** (?) (masculine name, see *Gapi*, *Kabbi*, *Kappi*). O.Dan. *Kampi* (found as a by-name) (etymology uncertain), OW.Norse *Kampi* (found as a by-name). Derived from OW.Norse *kampr* m. "mustache". Nominative: *kabi* U792. Refs: Lind col. 674, Lind Bin. col. 185 f.

**Kani** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Kane* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse by-name *Kani*. From OW.Norse *kani* m. "bowl; boat". Accusative: *kana* Sö69, Vg152. Refs: Lind Bin. col. 186 f., Fritzner Suppl. p. 188.

**KanpR** (masculine name). O.Dan. by-name *Kamp* (?), OW.Norse by-name *Kampr*. From OW.Norse *kanpr*, *kampr* m. "moustache". Nominative: *kabR* Vg30 / (see *GapR*) Accusative: *konb* Ög131\$ (by-name). Refs: Lind Bin. col. 186.

**Kappi** (?) (masculine name, see *Gapi*, *Kabbi*, *Kampi*). O.Swed. *Kappe* (found as a by-name, etymology uncertain), OW.Norse by-name *Kappi*. From OW.Norse *kappi* m. "warrior". Nominative: *kabi* U792. Refs: Hellquist 1912 p. 98, Lind Bin. col. 187 f.

**Kári** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Kari* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Kare* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Kári* (found as a by-name). From the OW.Norse adjective \**kárr* (see → *Kárr*). Nominative: *kare* Sö298, *kari* Ög81B, Sö217, U259, U683, U797, DR287, [karl] U16†, *kori* U172 (see Williams 1990 p. 78). Genitive: *kara* U956, Gs11. Accusative: *kara* SöFv1971;208, U37, U532, U866, U1065\$, U1146. Examples in U956, Gs11 refer to the same person. See also *Blá-Kári*, *Færð-Kári*.

**Karl** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Karl* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Karl* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Karl* (found as a by-name). From OW.Norse *karl* m. "free man". Nominative: *Karl* ÖI118\$, Ög234, Ög235\$, Sö274, Sö298, Sm61, U306, U311, U321A, U934, U985, U1060, DRM49, DRM50, [karl] U885, U904, Gs11,

[karl] M10(?), [karl] U1080\$, [karl] U1115†, [k-rl] U906, ...arl U901. Accusative: [karal] Ög44†, *karl* Sö205, Sm71, Vg112, U36, U689, DR127, [karl] Vg42†, U317†, ...arl U384B, ...arl U317†, ...r Ög237(?). The same person is referred to in the examples in Ög234, Ög235 and possibly Ög237; Vg112, DR127; U901, U904.

**Karli** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Karli* (found as a by-name *Karle*), O.Swed. *Karle* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Karli*. By-name of → *Karl* or derived from the by-name *karl*. Nominative: *karli* Ög201\$A, Vg137, [karli] Ög44† Accusative: [ka---] Sm34† / (see *Gauti*). Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 59, Hald 1971 p. 71, Kousgård Sørensen 1984 p. 115 f.

**KarlungR** (masculine name). O.Swed. *Karlung*, OW.Norse *Körlungr*. Derived from OW.Norse *karl* m. "free man". Nominative: [kalukR] U158†(?), karlunkr U1163 Genitive: *karuks* DRNOR1997:6 / (see *KárungR*). Accusative: *karluk* UFv1976;107, [karluk] U1133† Note: See Ståhle 1946 p. 93 f., Kousgård Sørensen 1984 p. 65 ff. on the formation of patronymics in -*ing*, -*ung*.

**Kární** (?) (masculine name, see *Garni*, *GæiRni*). Derived from (OW.Norse) *kárn* m. (see Fritzner Suppl.) "a type of bird"? Compare with the OW.Norse by-name *Kárn*. Accusative: *karna* Ög67

**Kárr** (masculine name). OW.Norse *Kárr* (found as a by-name). From the OW.Norse adjective \**kárr* (< Germanic \**kaura-* "bowed, curved") with the sense partly of "curly, wavy", partly "obstinate, pugnacious, reluctant". Nominative: *kar* Sö128, U644\$, U792, ka(r) U643, U654\$, karR Vg73, ...karR Sm90 / (see -*kárr*). Accusative: *kaur* Vg56\$ (?). Refs: Kousgård Sørensen 1974, Elmevik 1997.. Examples in U644, U654 refer to the same person.

**-kárr** m. See also the single element name → *Kárr*. Names in -*kárr* usually are found as a compound with an adjective. Compounds: *Hvit-*, *Ingi-*(?), *Óðin-*, *Rauð-*, *Styr-*.

**-kárr** (see *Kárr*) Nominative: ...karR Sm90.

**Karsi** (masculine name). O.Swed. by-name *Karse* < \**Karl-si*, derived from a by-name of → *Karl*, or identical with the Swedish dialect

word *karse* "wicker, basket". Nominative: [karsi] U343†, U364\$. Refs: Hellberg 1965 p. 27, Lagman 1990 p. 76 f. These examples all refer to the same person. Note: the O.Dan. by-name *Karse* seems to be unrelated; see DGP 2 col. 543.

**Kasi (?)** (masculine name, see *Gási, Kassi*). O.Dan. *Kase* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Kase* (found as a by-name). Name related to the Swedish dialect word *kase* "heap, pile". Nominative: *kase* U249. Refs: DGP 2 col. 545, Lagman 1990 p. 76 f.

**Kassi (?)** (masculine name, see *Gási, Kasi*). O.Dan. by-name *Kasse*, O.Swed. by-name *Kasse*. Related to Swedish *kasse* "wicker, basket", Danish *kasse* "chest". Nominative: *kase* U249. Refs: DGP 2 col. 545, Lagman 1990 p. 76 f.

**Káta** (feminine name). Feminine equivalent to → *Káti*. Nominative: *Kata* DR277. Accusative: *katu* Vg79

**Káti** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Kati* (?) (found as a by-name?), OW.Norse *Káti* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. by-name *Kate*. From the OW.Norse adjective *kátr* "glad, cheerful". Nominative: *Kati* Vg177, ka[ti] Sö152, [Kati] U189†. Genitive: *Kata* Sm144A. Accusative: *Kata* Ög88 / (see *Gaddi*), [kata] ÖI10{5}†.

**Ká-UlfR** (masculine name). A masculine name, → *UlfR*, prefixed with a by-name, which is identical to the OW.Norse verb *ká* "to destroy even peace and calm". Nominative: *kaulfR* DR280. Refs: DGP 1 col. 719 f.

**Kaupi** (masculine name). O.Swed. by-name *Køpe*, OW.Norse by-name *Kaupi* (?). From OW.Norse *kaupi* m. "purchaser, merchant". Nominative: *kaubi* Sö325

**KilfiR** (?) (masculine name). Of uncertain etymology. Nominative: *kilfihR* BoBoije\$QC.

**KiúlákR** (?) (masculine name, see *GiúlákR*). Originally a Celtic name; compare with OW.Norse *Kiallakr*. Nominative: *giulakr* U287 (?; see Åhlén 1997 p. 99 not 71), *kiulakr* U42, [kiula(in)...] Sö339†. Accusative: *kiulik* Ög20\$. Refs: Janzén 1947a p. 250.

**Kiúli** (masculine name). Of uncertain etymology. Three explanations are presented: 1) Short form of → *KiúlákR* 2) Derived from OW.Norse *kjóll* "ship" with the suffix -inn (for example *kiulin*), 3) construction from a place-name in *Kjul-* (in O.Swed. \**kiúl* m., OW.Norse *kjóll* m. **KlakkR** (?) (masculine name). OW.Norse *Klakkr*, O.Dan. by-name *Klak*, O.Swed. by-name *Klak*. From OW.Norse *klakkr* m. "peg". Nominative: *klakR* Sm133A / (see *GlöggR*). Accusative: *klakR* DR325(?) (see Lerche Nielsen 1997 Appendix p. 3, 13, P. Larsson 2000 p. 16 med not 10).

**Klefi** (?) (masculine name). Of uncertain etymology. Accusative: [klefa] Sö310†.

**Kleme(n)t** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Klement*, O.Swed. *Klemet*, OW.Norse *Klemetr*. Christian name, from Latin *Clemens*. Accusative: [k](l)[em](in)t U618.

**KleppiR** or **KlippiR** (masculine name, see *GlippiR*). Derived from OW.Norse *kleppr* m. "lump" (< \**klimp-*). Nominative: *klibiR* DR271. Refs: Hansen 1926, Hald 1971 p. 74 ff.

**Klintr** (masculine name). O.Dan. by-name *Klint*, O.Swed. by-name *Klint* from (O.Swed.) *klinger* "cliff, hillock". Nominative: [klintr] U1143(?). Accusative: *Klint* Sm137. Refs: DGP 2 col. 575.

**KnaggR** (masculine name, see *KnakkR*). O.Swed. *Knag* (found as a by-name), O.Dan. by-name *Knag*. Related to the Swedish *knag*, *knagg* "projecting piece of wood, knot on a tree". Nominative: [knakr] U628†. Refs: Hellquist 1912 p. 101, DGP 2 col. 580.

**KnakkR** (masculine name, see *KnaggR*) From OW.Norse *knakkr* m. "stool, small chair"? Nominative: [knakr] U628† Note: Apart from *KnaggR* and *KnakkR* gives an additional two interpretations in UR 3 (s. 62).

**Knútr** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Knut* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Knut* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Knútr* (found as a by-name). From OW.Norse *knútr* m. "knot". Nominative: knutr Sö217, U92, U344, UFv1953;266, Vs15A, |knutr U1149, [knutr] U818, N184, knu-... U38, kunt UFv1992;159b(?). Genitive: knus DR345\$, |knuts U194. Dative: knuti Ög111\$, kuti Sö14\$ / (see *Gauti*). Accusative: knut ÖgNOR1997;28, Vs15A. Refs: DGP 1 col. 774. Examples in Ög111, Sö14(?), U194, U344, N184 and possibly DR345 refer to the same person.

**KnæikiR** (?) (masculine name, see *GnæggiR*). Derived from the OW.Norse verb *kneikja* "press, squeeze". Genitive: knikis Vg177. Refs: Sikström 1990.

**Kol**, see *Kul-*.

**Kolla** (feminine name). OW.Norse *Kolla* (found as a by-name, etymology uncertain). Short form of feminine names in *Kol-* (→ *Kul-*)? Nominative: kola UFv1992;168bA Note: the OW.Norse names in Lind Bin. (col. 210) under OW.Norse *kolla* f. "female; woman".

**Kolli**, see *Kulli / Kolli*.

**KorpR** (?) (masculine name). O.Swed. by-name *Korp*, OW.Norse by-name *Korpr*. From OW.Norse *korpr* m. "raven". Nominative: kor-... Öl37\$.

**Krínán** (masculine name). Celtic name. Genitive: krínais BrOlsen;190b\$.

**Kristín** (feminine name). O.Dan. *Kristina*, O.Swed. *Kristina*, *Kirstin* etc., OW.Norse *Kristín* Christian name; Norse form of Latin *Christina*. Nominative: kr(e)stin UFv1959;196.

**KrókR** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Krok* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Krok* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Krókr* (found as a by-name). From OW.Norse *krókr* m. "hook". Nominative: kruk U32, U866, [kruk] U191†, kurukr U1156. Accusative: krok U604, (k)(r)(u)(k) DR217\$A, [kruk] Ög194†, U432†, [K -- (K)] DR106† / (see *KvígR*, *KvikR*), -uruk Ög98. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 51.

**KrumR** (masculine name). OW.Norse *Krumr* (found as a by-name), O.Dan. by-name *Krum*, O.Swed. by-name *Krum*. From an adjective corresponding to Nynorsk *krum* "stiff and crooked in the fingers because of cold", Swed. *krum* "bent over, hunched". Genitive: karumbus U524. Refs: Janzén 1947b p. 51.

**Krúsa** or *Krusa* (masculine name) O.Dan. *Krusa* (etymology uncertain). Of uncertain etymology. Nominative: krusa DR339. Refs: DGP 1 col. 805, Lerche Nielsen 1997 p. 23.

**Kufri** (masculine name, see *Guðfríðr*). O.Swed. *Kofre* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Kofri* (found as a by-name). From OW.Norse *kofri* m. "hood, hat". Nominative: [kufri] Vs11†. Refs: Salberger 1978 p. 75 ff.

**SkáungR** (?) (masculine name). Of uncertain etymology. Nominative: *skaukr* Ög135.

**Skírlaug** (feminine name). First element *Skír-*, From the OW.Norse adjective *skírr* from the OW.Norse adjective *skírr* "clean, pure, clear, bright"; seems not to be an example of a Scandinavian personal name, but rather from either OH.Germ. or O.Engl. Second element → *-laug*. Nominative: [skirlauh] Sö147†. Refs: Searle 1897 p. 411, Fö. col. 1308, von Feilitzen 1937 p. 356, Kaufmann 1968 p. 307. Note: First element *Skær-* in the O.Swed. masculine name *Skærlek* (see Thors 1959 p. 84) is thought to be unconnected to *Skír-*. **Skæggi** (masculine name, see *Skagi*). O.Dan. *Skeggi* (found as a by-name), O.Swed. *Skægge* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Skeggi* (found as a by-name) Derived from (OW.Norse) *skegg* n. "beard". Nominative: *skagi* U119. Refs: Ekbo 1947 p. 274. See also *Guða-Skagi / Skakki / Skæggi*.

**Skær (?)** (masculine name, see *Skarfr*). Occurs as Scandinavian by-name in England. From (or related to) OW.Norse *sker* n. "skerry, a cliff or rock that sticks up out of the water". Accusative: *s:kar* Ög10\$Q. Refs: Fellows Jensen 1968 p. 248.

Nominative: *simiþr* Sö61, *smiþr* Ög109, DR58 (by-name), DR91 (by-name), DRNOR1997:6 (by-name). Genitive: *smiþ* BrOlsen;208b (by-name). Accusative: *smiþ* Öl58{28}, *sm - ...* U802(?).

**Snari** (masculine name). O.Dan. *Snari* (found as a by-name; se DGP 2 s.n. *Snar*, *Snara*), O.Swed. *Snare* (found as a by-name), OW.Norse *Snari*. From the OW.Norse adjective *snarr* "fast, rash, hasty; sharp". Nominative: *snari* U44\$B, U637, UFv1953;266. Examples in U44, UFv1953;266 refer to the same person.

# PLACE-NAMES

## Introduction

There are 137 place-names presented here; in addition in addition there are circa 20 uninterpreted examples. The place-names presented here are shown under headings in the reconstructed normalized Old Norse nominative form. (Only in four examples, GrikkiaR, IórsaliR, Ísland and Særkland, are the original names in the inscriptions in the nominative case.)

We did not strive to provide etymological explanations. Nevertheless in many such cases, it is shown by the index form which is chosen based on the treatment of the name in the relevant inscription code. Observe that the name interpretations for these materials in DR are in the chapter, "Ord- og navneforråd" (DR col. 625 ff.).

Relevant literature, if any, is listed at the end of the name entry. Where reconstructions are uncertain, they are indicated with question marks within parens (?) after the index form.

Identification of place-names for Sweden are made along the same lines as in OAU, with the exception that counties (*landskap*) are listed instead of provinces (*län*), for Denmark and Norway we follow the practices in DS and of NSL respectively. Other place-names are identified with the help of other, general reference works. Where identifications were unsure, we indicate this with a question mark before the place-name. Two names in this listing (*Hræiðmarr* and *Miðgarðr*) must be described as mythical.

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## A Note on Translation

This translation was prepared for my own personal use, with my main interest being the various forms of the names and their etymologies rather than the runic data. My Swedish is rough, and in places the translation will be the gist of my understanding of the original text rather than an exact and perfect translation.

However, wherever possible in the name listings I compared any term in OW.Norse back to the Cleasby-Vigfusson dictionary (Cleasby, Richard and Guðbrandr Vigfusson. *An Icelandic-English Dictionary*. 2nd. ed. Oxford: Clarendon. 1957.) to help guide my translation of the Swedish definition of the same term.

If utter accuracy is necessary to you, please compare back to the original document in Swedish.

I also wish to give special thanks to Sandra Straubhaar, Ph.D. (Brynhildr jarla Kormakssdóttir), Gale Langseth (Sigrid Þóvaldsdóttir) and Christer Romson (Lindorm Eriksson) for assistance in figuring out several Swedish words that were beyond my dictionary. Christer Romson especially put in a heroic effort to read through the document, and suggested corrections to a number of my worst errors. Any errors remaining, however, are purely my own and should in no way be attributed to any of these fine people.
